### THE UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE - 27,845

- The main campus in Knoxville is the oldest and largest university in Tennessee
- More than 27,000 undergraduate and graduate students, and 1,400 faculty members
- Offers over 90 major programs in nine different colleges
- Twelve colleges and schools with major research programs in the fields of energy, polymer engineering, advanced and composite materials, biomedical sciences and geological sciences
- Nationally ranked programs in accounting, business administration, logistics, and engineering
- Classified as a Carnegie Foundation Research Institute
- Nationally known College of Veterinary Medicine is one of only 28 in the country.

## 4-year Colleges and Universities

### BRYAN COLLEGE - 1,489
